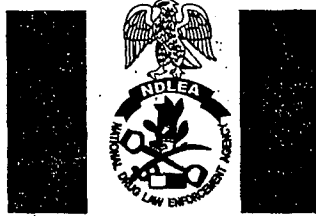

### VITAL INFORMATION FOR VESSELS VISITING NIGERIA'S PORTS

We are pleased to give you some vital information regarding boarding/rummaging of vessels visiting Nigeria Ports as thus:

- A. Basic requirements of NDLEA Officer(s) on board any tanker/container vessel
- B. Penalties for offenders and fine for obstruction of duty
- C. Guidelines on Narcotic & Controlled drugs and list of Narcotic drugs.

#### A. BASIC REQUIREMENT

- (1) Narcotic List
- (2) Medicine chest inventory list
- (3) Bonded store list if narcotics or medicines are under seal from the last port of call.
- (4) Personal medicine list
- (5) Port of call list
- (6) Crew list

#### B. PENALTIES FOR OFFENDERS AND FINE STIPULATIONS FOR OBSTRUCTION OF DUTY

Section 20 subsection A i.e. S 20 (a) of NDLEA Act (a) 30 Laws of the Federation as Amended 2004 States that:

Any person who without lawful authority engages on the production, manufacture, extraction, preparation, offering for sale, distribution, sale, delivery on any term whatsoever breakage, dispatch, dispatch in transit, transportation, importation or exportation on any Narcotic drug or any psychotropic substance contrary to the provisions of the 1961 convention and its protocols or the 1971 convention against illicit traffic in Narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances 1989 will be imprisoned for life.

Also interesting to note that section 49 subsection a, b S49 (a-b) of NDLEA Act cap 30 laws of the Federation as Amended 2004 State that

- (a) "Any person who, willfully obstructs the Agency or any authorized officer of the powers conferred on the Agency by the Act or.
- (b) Fails to comply with any lawful enquiry or requirement made by any authorized officer in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment for a term not

exceeding 5 years or to "A fine of \$20,000.00 or its equivalent in Nigeria Naira, or both imprisonment and fine.

### C. GUIDELINES ON NARCOTICS AND CONTROLLED DRUGS

In view of this, all psychotropic substances are referred to as controlled drugs, which are classified as narcotics, while the ordinary medicines are not controlled because these are none hard drugs.

1. All ordinary medicines must be displayed in the hospital cabins or locker on a well arranged form and should be numbered for easy and proper identification.
2. **It is a breach of law (offence) if any ordinary medicine is found or detected in the mix of controlled drugs, i.e. Captain's cabin and vice versa.**
3. All controlled drugs are expected to be in the custody of the captain and not medicines referred to as the ordinary medicines in order to conform with the provisions of article "30" of 1961 single convention of United Nations as referred to as international regulations.
4. All controlled drugs and ordinary medicines must be declared in separate list, having their headings for controlled drugs as "Narcotics list" and for the ordinary medicines as "hospital inventory list" or medicine chest inventory list".
5. All drugs should have a well-designed manufacturer stamp indicating the expiring and manufactured date on it. Any form of hand printing on any medicine or narcotics will be viewed as a total breakdown of law and order and shall be compelled to face the law squarely as provided on the said article.
6. **All expired drugs or medicines are not allowed to be sighted on board.**
7. All record of administration of either controlled drugs or medicines are expected to be recorded in the medicine logbook and presented for check.
8. On no account shall drugs be brought ashore.
9. **It should be borne in mind that the article "30" of single convention on "narcotics drugs control" of 1961 frowns at theft and diversion of stocks of control drugs. Therefore captains are to be held responsible if there is any contradiction of any form.**

Notes: 1. Section 8 subsection b-d (S.8 (b) of NDLEA Act cap 30 laws of federation as amended in 2004 empowers NDLEA Officers (operatives) to be:

- (a) Working in collaboration with the department of customs and excise in monitoring the movement of goods and persons in any customs area, customs stations, customs ports or customs airport and searching cargoes and out going vessels, including pleasure crafts, and fishing vessels, as well as aircrafts and vehicles and when appropriate searching crew members passengers and their baggage.

- (b) Detecting consignments suspected of containing narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances coming into or of a customs area, customs station customs port or customs airport.
  - (c) Maintaining surveillance in harbor and dock areas and at airport and boarder control points.
2. Any person who, without lawful authority engages in production, manufacture, extraction, preparation, offering for sale, distribution, sale, delivery on any term whatsoever breakage dispatch, dispatch in transit, transportation, importation or exportation or any narcotics drugs or any psychotropic substance contrary to the provisions of the 1961 convention and its protocols, or the 1971 convention or the United Nations convention against illicit traffic in narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances 1989, will be imprisonment for life.
3. The NDLEA operatives on board any vessel have the statutory obligations to enforce these laws in totality in order to clear this great nation Nigeria from illegal trafficking in narcotics drugs and psychotropic substances. **The captain or agent will be held responsible for breach of any aforementioned laws.**

Pleased be warned.

These medicines treated as narcotics (controlled drugs) according to Nigerian/international regulations include all kinds of under listed controlled drugs. i.e. Spray, inhalant, drops, injections, tablets, HCL etc. As such are to be kept in master safe, under key and lock.

Ignorance is not an excuse.

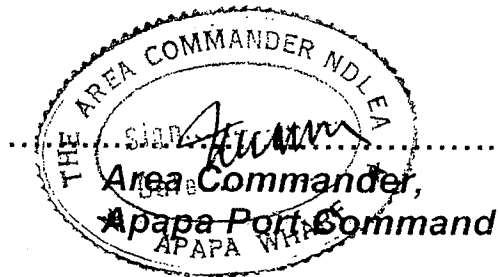
